FAM curatorial staff collaborated with Kickapoo tribal leaders to select these representative objects and interpretive materials.

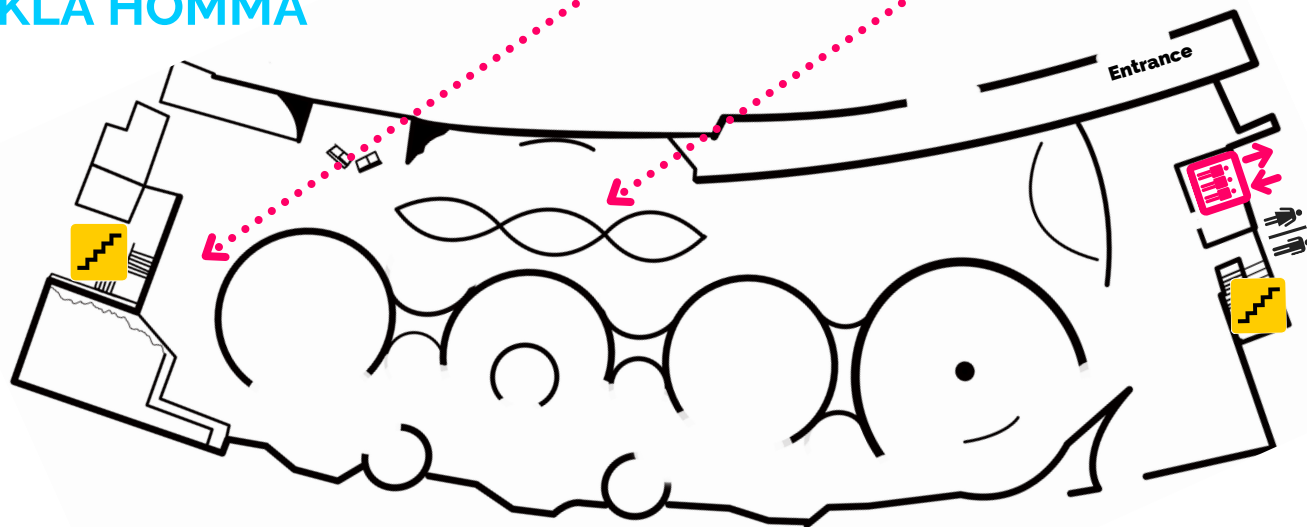


Panel: Super Indian

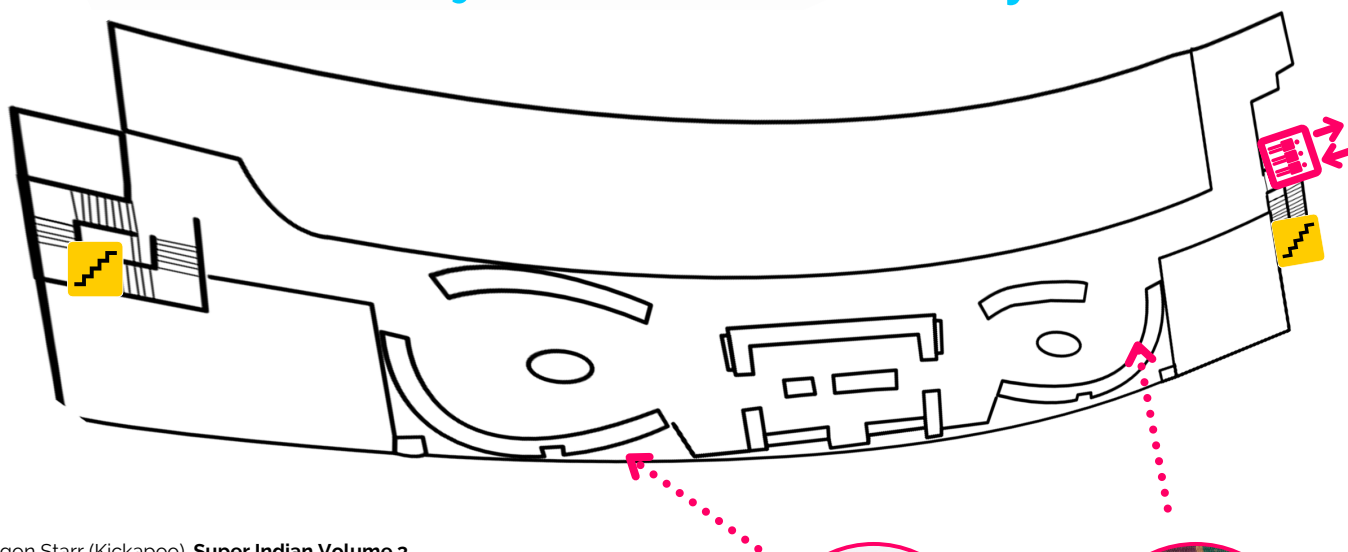

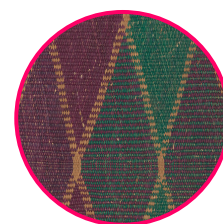
