FAM curatorial staff collaborated with Miami tribal leaders to select these representative objects and interpretive materials.

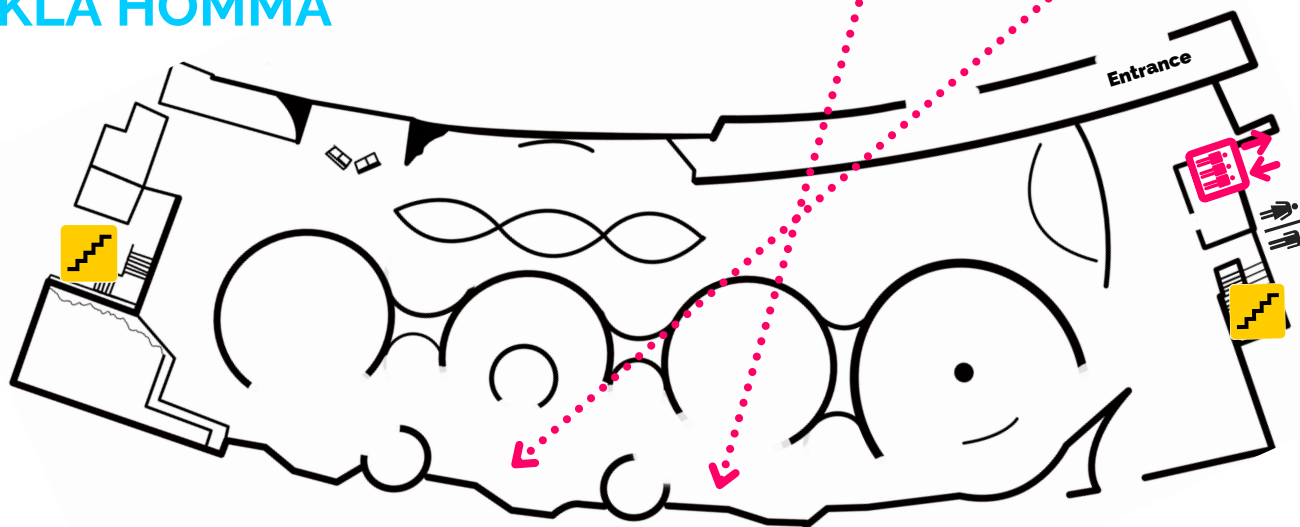


Panel: Little Turtle

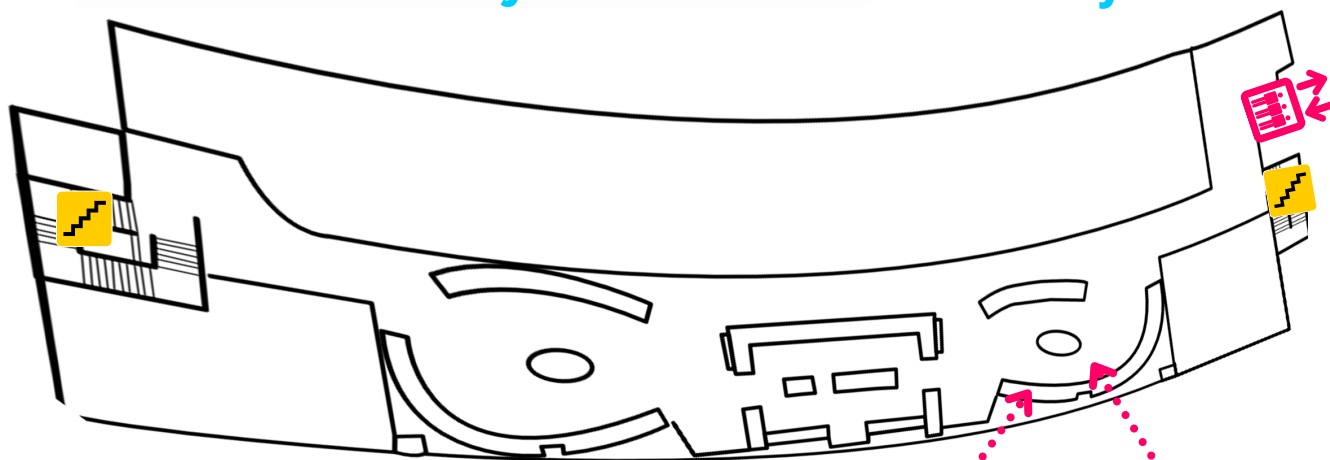


Panel: Delegation of Tribal Leaders with President Andrew Johnson

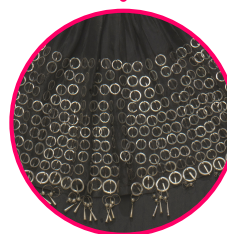
