FAM curatorial staff collaborated with Peoria tribal leaders to select these representative objects and interpretive materials.

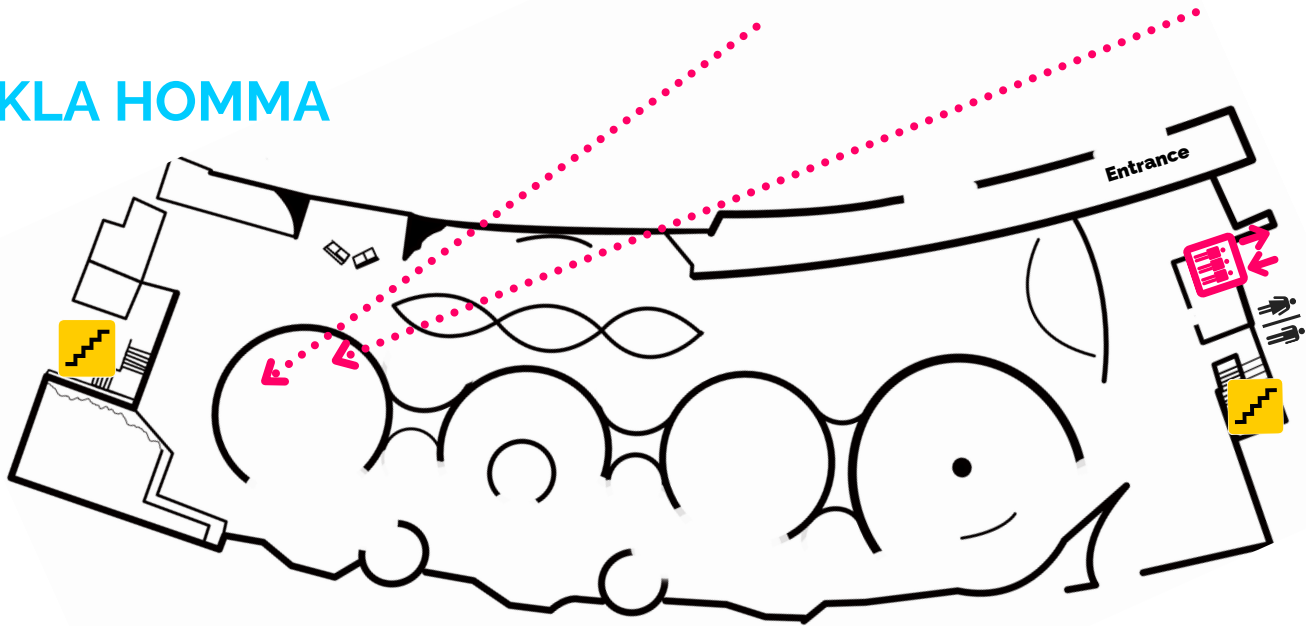


Panel: Monument dedicated to Nine Federally Recognized Tribes

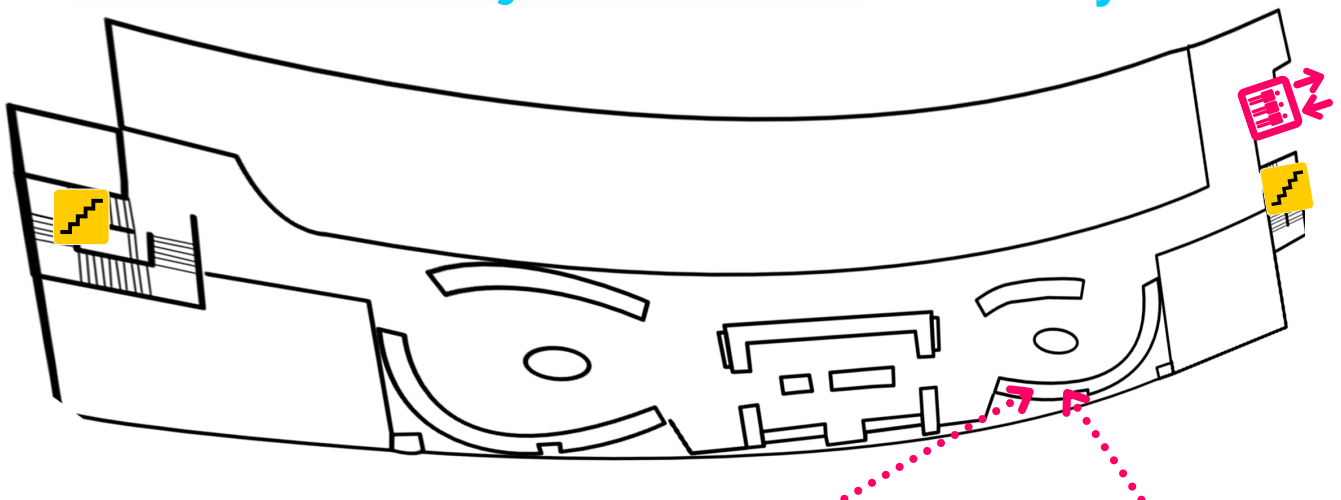

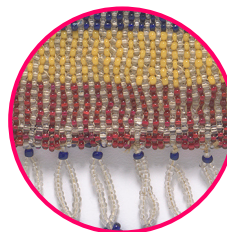
